Aspen Medical International wins a second International Stability Operations Association Vanguard Award for its work in Mosul

Aspen Medical associate company, US-based Aspen Medical International (AMI), has been awarded the International Stability Operations Association (ISOA) Vanguard award for a second time for its work supporting the World Health Organization (WHO) and the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) in Mosul, Iraq, from March 2017 until May 2018. The company managed three trauma field hospitals and three maternity units on the outskirts of Mosul.

The ISOA Stability Operations Awards recognise small, medium, and large companies who consistently demonstrate commitment to accountability, transparency, and ethics in the stability operations field. The top award in each category is presented as a Vanguard Award.

AMI's Group Medical Director, Dr Thomas G Crabtree, MD, FACS said, "This award is wonderful recognition not only for the Aspen Medical team globally but also the incredible Iraqi health professionals we worked alongside in Mosul. Together we worked as one team in the shadow of ISIS and achieved incredible outcomes."

The international team brought together by Aspen Medical treated 47,890 patients and delivered 2,997 babies at the three facilities. The mortality rate overall was 0.39%.

Last year, AMI won the Vanguard award for its work in West Africa during the Ebola Outbreak of 2014 – 2015. The outbreak began in Guinea spreading to Liberia and Sierra Leone and resulted in 28,616 infections leading to 11,310 deaths across the region.
